CELEBRATING THE YEAR!

Dear Parents and Carers

As we reach the end of another enriching and fulfilling year at JCA, we wanted to share some of the many achievements. We have made some fantastic achievements in 2015/2016.

You will be pleased to know that children across our school achieved excellent results in all phases of the academy and continue to perform above national expectations. Some headlines for you are:

- 86% of our Foundation Stage children achieved the 'Good Level of Development'. This is another increase from last year and a significant increase from all previous years. This is our highest achievement of Jerry Clay history.
- 100% of our Y1 children passed the phonics screen check. Again, the highest achievement ever for us.
- Y2 children achieved incredibly high with their SATS with 97% achieving the expected in Reading, 93% working at expected in Maths and 83% at expected in Writing. We cannot compare these results to previous years as they are incomparable because of the new challenging standard. We are awaiting national averages for this age group. We are very pleased with this achievement.
- Y6 children exceeded national expectations in writing and reading and achieved national expectations in Maths with the very challenging tests. More will be released on this, including percentages when all marks are completely finalized and progress measures are released in September. We are very proud of our children. We achieved very pleasing percentages for children working at greater depth in all subjects.
- The children who receive the Pupil Premium allocation achieved at least as well or better than other pupil groups

In addition to this, learning in books and attitudes to learning displayed by our children continue to improve. Evidence from our pupil survey highlights that children enjoy coming to school and feel proud of Jerry Clay Academy. Our outstanding learning displays and classroom learning environments are evidence of this.

Please take some time to review each class's top 3 memories from the year. A school is so much more than achievement in individual subjects, it is about achievement holistically.

On a final note, I would like to give my special thanks to Mrs. Smith who will be stepping down from Deputy Headteacher this week. As she goes in semi-retirement, I am sure you will all join me in thanking her for the excellent work she has carried out for the academy. Mrs. Smith will continue to teach in Year 6 on a Thursday and Year 2 & 3 on a Friday.

We also say goodbye and thank you to Mrs. Tanuku who is relocating to Blackburn. Mrs. Tanuku will be missed by the JCA team; however, I know that she will come back from time-to-time to see us.

Good luck goes to Mrs. Longley who is going on maternity leave this week and will have her baby any day soon! We know that Mrs. Longley will be coming to visit over the course of the year with her new little addition to her family.

Finally I would like to say a special thank you and goodbye to our Year 6 children who will be leaving us to go to secondary school. Our Year 6s have been an absolute delight. I will miss them all dearly; however, look forward to hearing all about their achievements as they progress.

Top 3 Sports Achievements this Year



1. Achieving Sports Mark silver award for all of the successes we have experienced in sport this year. Next year we are going for Gold.
2. 74% of our children have attended extra-curricular sports clubs this year
3. We have offered over 14 different sports as an extra-curricular club this year

Phonics is becoming a significant area of strength for the academy

Our Read Write Inc. programme has strengthened significantly over 2 years. We are pleased to report that:

- 100% of our children in Year 1 achieved the Phonics Screening test with an average score of 38 out of 40
- 100% in Year 2 achieved their retake of the Phonics Screening (3 children from last year)
- We are currently being reviewed to have Model School Status
- Miss Ashton has been selected as a Model Teacher. There are only 4 Model Teachers in the country!
- We have been recommended to the DFE to lead Phonics with a group of schools to help them develop their early reading. This will help to further strengthen our practice.

Writing has strengthened across the whole academy

1 of our main priority points this year has been to develop writing. We have succeeded in this and can report that progress measures and standards are exceptionally high.

- 83% of Year 2 children achieved the expected standard for Writing
- 87% of Year 6 children achieved the expected standard for Writing, well above the national average

Looking ahead/ some changes to make our academy even better

- **School meals:** we have listened to your feedback about our meals service and are pleased to announce that from September we will be implementing the ISS 'Cypad' system which many ISS schools already use. This means that children will make their meal choice on the classroom whiteboard each day and these orders go straight through to the kitchen. The children won't need to wear the coloured bands, which are sometimes lost, and we shouldn't experience situations where your child doesn't get their meal of choice. The existing menu will continue until October half term and then the new winter menu will be introduced. We use pupil feedback & work closely with our cook, Martin, to tailor the menu to suit the JCA pupils preferences. With the Cypad system payments for meals are made directly to ISS, details of how to log into their online payment system will be issued at the start of term. If you have a remaining balance, please ensure that this is paid by the end of July. Please don't pay any extras onto your accounts.
- **Email communications:** from September we will be moving to email communications instead of paper wherever possible; we hope that this will make communications with school more straightforward, there will no longer be letters buried in school bags! And as school budgets are squeezed, reducing paper and photocopying costs means that budget can be directed to other key areas. If you haven't already provided your email address then please let the office have this as soon as possible.
- **Arts Mark Gold:** We are aiming to achieve the Arts Mark Gold for all of the work which we carry out in the academy on the arts. This will hopefully be a recognition of all of this work.

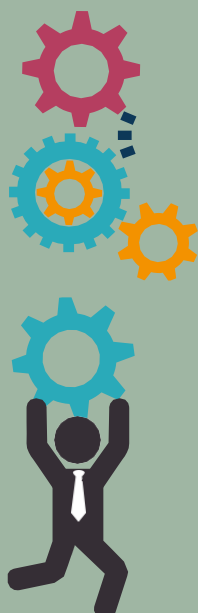
