# What to expect from Year 5



Pupils will have one hour of Maths and one hour of Literacy each day.

All other lessons will be based around the current topic, as well as lessons in RE, Music and Modern foreign language (Spanish). Children are also taught PSCHÉ through Wish time. The first focal points of this will be ‘Working with others’ and ‘Respect’.

Children will have opportunities to read every day and they will also partake in handwriting practise.

Children continue to have P.E/ swimming. PE will be on a Monday and Swimming will be on a Thursday afternoon until February half term.

# Curriculum coverage



Reading – use phonics to help read unfamiliar words  
And develop understanding of their meanings  
Make comparisons of events, characters and themes within books  
Read and understand a range of genres  
Make predictions based on evidence given  
Discuss how authors use language for effect  
Participate in discussions about books  
Provide justifications for views on what they have read

# Curriculum coverage



Writing – continue to develop spelling, including silent letter words

Edit and redraft longer passages of writing

Expand vocabulary choices

Use advanced organisational and presentational devices in writing

Develop knowledge and use of varying punctuation devices and grammatical features of the English Language.

# Curriculum coverage



Other subjects are covered mainly through topics.

Each topic has a specific curriculum subject focus, e.g. our first topic ‘What’s out there?’ has a specific SCIENCE focus with a smaller majority of coverage in other subject areas.

In RE, we will be looking at 3 religions (Christianity, Islam and Hinduism) and how they contrast and compare through beliefs, symbols, sacred texts and places of worship.
