Learning across the school this week

<u>Year 1</u>


Year 1 have had a very busy two weeks and are really enjoying our 'Dungeons and Dragons' topic. We have been focussed our learning on the parts of the castle and why each part is important. In Science we have looking at objects from a castle and sorting them on their materials and their properties.

In Literacy, we have continued with our weekly news and we have been striving to use 'and' to join our sentences and time connectives to add more structure into our sentences. We have also been continuing learning about 'Zog'



and have been reordering pictures and retelling the story using our time connectives.

During Maths, we have been counting forwards to 10 focusing on our perfect number formation and writing our number



words. We have been demonstrating excellent striving skills to count accurately and have been using brilliant thinking skills to solve missing number tracks and check our work.

Finally, in Art we have been using different sketching and shading techniques to begin our Dragon's eye project. We persevered learn the different art vocabulary and apply our and shading skills into our first sketch.

<u>Year 2</u>

Our mining topic has really taken off over the last couple of weeks. We have continued to consider what life was like down a mine and we experienced this during our trip to the National Coal Mining Museum. Whilst we had a workshop to discover some of the tools that were used by miners as well as who did each job, we learnt a lot from actually being down the mine!! We were able to discuss what the conditions were like and also experienced some of the sounds that miners had to work with! On the trip, we were really pleased to hear comments from the staff at the museum to say how good our behaviour was as well as how well we listened to what we were told!

Year 3

Year 3 are continuing to enjoy 'The Lost World' topic, particularly through focusing their learning around the Great Barrier Reef and what sea creatures live there. We have been following the story of Finding



Nemo, where the children have produced some fantastic stories of being a fish that is lost at sea. These are going to be published



and illustrated before being displayed on the classroom walls.

During Maths, we have been comparing numbers in different ways, the whole class has perservered and demonstrated some excellent thinking skills to understand their work. They will continue to use these skills when we progress onto addition and subtraction.

Finally, year 3 have been thoroughly enjoying their music lessons with the music specialist. Here they have begun to understand pitch

through using a variety of different percussion instruments, including chime bars from the xylophone


Year 4

Year 4 have been continuing with our topic 'The Hero's Journey' by looking in more depth at Ancient Greek myths and finding out about Ancient Greece. We completed maps showing significant places in Ancient Greece and took on the role of a family member from Athens. In Literacy, we have taken on the challenge of creating 'The Lost Myth' based on clues left on stone tablets from thousands of years ago. We chose a hero, a beast and quest before using a lot of our imagination to write our own myth. These are coming on really well.

We are continuing on our artistic journey to create Greek theatre masks and, having experimented with tones of black, white and grey using paint and charcoal to create depth, we have now begun using light relief to build 3D masks from card. They are going to look amazing!

In Maths, we have been really challenging ourselves to use concrete and pictorial resources to explain the place value of four digit numbers, comparing, ordering, rounding and adding 10s, 100s and 1000s.







Striving to be the best we can be'

Year 5

Year 5 are continuing to enjoy our topic 'The Great Divide' where we are focusing on World War II. We have been enjoying our class novel 'Letters from the Lighthouse' and the children have been creating some fantastic writing in Topic that links to this, empathising with the evacuees in the story.

In Literacy, we have published our setting descriptions of





Budmouth Point, including some amazing illustrations and we have now started our next text type, which is Newspaper reports.


During Maths, we have been doing lots of focal work on negative numbers including in sequences. We found this quite tricky but have been persevering. We are now ready to move onto developing our addition and subtraction skills in a variety of contexts.

Year 6

What a busy few weeks Year 6 have had! Not only have we been working extremely hard in class, we have also been thinking (a lot!) about the Junior Leadership Team interviews that took part last week. As Year 6 staff, we could not be more proud of the way the children approached this and also the way that they wished each other 'Good Luck' and 'Congratulations' when the results were announced – really demonstrating the JCA team



spirit! Over the last week, Year



6 have been rapidly increasing their confidence with the calculation methods and have learnt how to divide using the method of long division this week. While this is still in the very early stages, we have been impressed by how quickly the children have grasped this new method. Our RE topic this half term looks at marriage and love and the children this week have produced some fantastic pieces of work based on the title of, "Love is...". They are so good that some members of staff think that they should be sent to the Bishop of Wakefield!
