The children considered what they thought might happen to the ladybird and suggested possible endings. We challenged the children to develop a narrative and then write the ending of the story. They thought that the ladybird would sneeze again and lose all of his spots! The children wrote amazing sentences and produced excellent story maps of their ladybird

adventures. The children have also been enjoying the outdoor provision in the sunny hot weather. They have particularly enjoyed constructing shelters, building sand bugs, painting and investigating the water area. We are starting to rehearse for our end of year celebration assembly. They really enjoyed rolling the ball to their friend and then at the goal to score a point.



Mathematical Development

In Maths, the children are learning to subtract so that they can count how many spots left on the ladybird. The children have also used subtraction problems in their writing.
